The most flawed part is the pricing. All of the prices given come from a single auction house where all the bags in the book were sold. It's almost like a catalog of the auction house with their past results versus a "field guide". Since all of the prices are from an auction, and from a single auction house, the sample size is way too narrow. And my guess is that most people don't sell their bags at big city auction houses. The other problem is that it would have been better to see a wider range of brands to give people an idea of what designers are collectible. Many of the ones shown are too obvious: Chanel--check, Hermes--check, LV--check, etc. Most people already know those are good finds. But what about some less common designer labels? I
